HIEROMARTYR ANTHIMOS OF NICOMEDIA & VENERABLE THEOKTISTOS, FELLOW ASCETIC WITH EUTHYMIOS THE GREAT • MARTYR CHARITON • NEW-MARTYR POLYDOROS OF CYPRUS PHOEBE THE DEACONESS OF CENCHREAE • RIGHTEOUS BASILISSA OF NICOMEDIA IOANIKIOS I, PATRIARCH OF SERBIA

- St. Phoebe came from a very busy port area called Cenchreae, a popular stop for people traveling from Syria or Asia Minor.
- St. Phoebe is recognized as the first woman deacon. She is honored as being the prototype for female deacons, just as St. Stephen is the prototype for male deacons. St. Paul gave recognition to St. Phoebe, thanking her in public.

I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deaconess of the church at Cenchreae, that you may receive her in the Lord as befits the saints, and help her in whatever she may require from you, for she has been a helper of many and of myself as well. (Romans 16:1-2)

Centuries later, St. John Chrysostom praised St. Phoebe's work for the Church as an inspiration and model for both men and women to imitate. He calls her a saint - a holy person and a woman who served the Church through the office of deacon. Since the beginning of the Church, women have been using their talents and gifts from God to serve.

Order for Holy Communion

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless a medical condition preclude it), being in church *before* the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.

As there are **NO CHURCH SCHOOL** classes today, children should sit with their parents and come to Communion with them. An usher will dismiss your row from the center aisle. Then return to your place by a side aisle for the prayers of thanksgiving and the final blessing and dismissal. Please let choir members pass when they come down for Communion.

A Warm Welcome to Our Guests

We are glad you are worshipping with us. Please note that participation in Holy Communion is limited to members of the Orthodox Church in good standing, who have prepared with prayer, fasting and a recent confession.

For all others: though we cannot share Communion with you—since it is an expression of membership and full unity in faith—you are welcome to come forward after the dismissal, receive a blessing and partake of the blessed bread (from the large bowls). Thy people do celebrate it, having been saved from the stain of iniquity, crying unto thee: The Barren doth give birth to the Theotokos, who nourisheth our life.

BRETHREN, be watchful, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love.

I rejoice at the coming of Stephanas and Fortunatus and Achaicos, because they have made up for your absence; for they refreshed my spirit as well as yours. Give recognition to such men.

Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew (21.33-42; 13th Sunday of Matthew)

THE LORD SPOKE THIS PARABLE: "There was a householder who planted a vineyard, and set a hedge around it, and dug a wine press in it, and built a tower, and let it out to tenants, and went into another country.

"When the season of fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants, to get his fruit; and the tenants took his servants and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again, he sent other servants, more than the first; and they did the same to them. Afterward, he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and have his inheritance.' And they took him and cast him out of the vineyard, and killed him. When therefore the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and let out the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruits in their seasons."




